CDBG RFQ Information and Technical Assistance Appointments

The [Community Development Block Grant](#) (CDBG) is a U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Entitlement Grant. The City of San Diego Economic Development Department administers these funds to partner organizations to support the projects and programs that serve local communities. Interested organizations can apply for this funding via the CDBG Annual Notice of Funding Available (NOFA) process.

The NOFA Process consists of two phases: the Request for Qualification (RFQ) phase and the Request for Proposals (RFP) phase.

The [Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security](#) (CARES) Act provided \$5 billion for the federal CDBG program. The CARES Act included the elimination of the CDBG 15% cap on public service activities. As a result, the San Diego City Council allocated an additional \$3.5 million of CDBG funds for public service activities. The City of San Diego will be combining the CARES Act Public Service NOFA process with the FY 2022 CDBG NOFA process.
